Thank you for your many gifts and generous spirit. Whether you contribute your time, talent or treasure, we greatly appreciate your interest and support.

ECS's efforts to help homeless adults and families obtain housing and social services have increased in strength and reach. For example, our Next Door Shelter, which accommodates 280 people every night, has remodeled its respite area for homeless patients released from San Francisco General Hospital. A collaborative venture with San Francisco's Department of Public Health, the respite staffing model has also been redesigned to offer more in-depth client attention.

Our Canon Barcus teen program has received, for the first time, a three-year grant commitment from the San Francisco Department of Children, Youth and their Families. The Canon Barcus Community House provides permanent supportive housing for 47 formerly homeless families. Under the guidance of ECS's social services staff, Canon Barcus' teens initiate and plan activities that augment what they learn in school and provide opportunities for leadership development. This grant will enhance staffing and fund educational and recreational outings.

ECS's supportive housing program has doubled in the last three years and now has more than 1,000 formerly homeless people in permanent housing. Our most recent development is Bishop Swing Community House, which will break ground this fall and open its door to 134 residents in early 2009.

Your volunteer work and contributions bring services and hope to more than 4,500 people. We are very grateful!

CHEFS and Seniors: A Perfect Partnership

CHEFS, ECS's culinary training program for homeless adults, had long been looking for a larger enterprise conducive to teaching students the fundamentals of a commercial kitchen. While opening a restaurant was considered, the business risks associated with it seemed more than what ECS could bear. However, another opportunity presented itself that seemed just right.

Each day for years, ECS's Canon Kip Senior Center had hot lunches brought in and served out of the same kitchen used by CHEFS. On July 1, CHEFS assumed the task itself. While this means greatly increased responsibilities for the CHEFS staff, the ability to provide a more rigorous training experience and in-house opportunities for graduates makes this new effort very appealing. The Canon Kip seniors, in turn, enjoy a home-made lunch cooked on site, a more varied menu, and the knowledge that they are helping people reclaim their gifts and abilities.

Keesling Trust Anchors Future Fund

In June 2007, ECS received a gift of \$428,000 from the Mary Heath Keesling Trust. Mrs. Keesling was the niece of Henry Ohloff, an associate priest at the Church of St. Mary the Virgin and Executive Director of Canon Kip Community House in the 1930s and '40s. In 1941, Henry Ohloff presided over the move from Second Street to 8th and Natoma, Canon Kip's current location, where the work of outreach and support to some of San Francisco's most vulnerable people continues today. Mrs. Keesling, generous in life, passed away in 2006, but, by naming Canon Kip in her estate plan, she ensured that her interest in the needs of poor and homeless men and women would continue to make a difference into the future.

Mrs. Keesling's gift will anchor ECS's Future Fund. Interest from the gift will be used to help meet the annual expenses of ECS's work at Canon Kip and support future special endeavors. Three ECS programs operate at the 8th and Natoma location: Canon Kip Community House, developed by ECS in 1994 and home to 103 formerly homeless adults; CHEFS, ECS's culinary training enterprise; and Canon Kip Senior Center, which is open 365 days a year to elderly and disabled adults for a noon meal, recreational activities, and social services.

ECS is enormously thankful to the late Mrs. Keesling and her family.

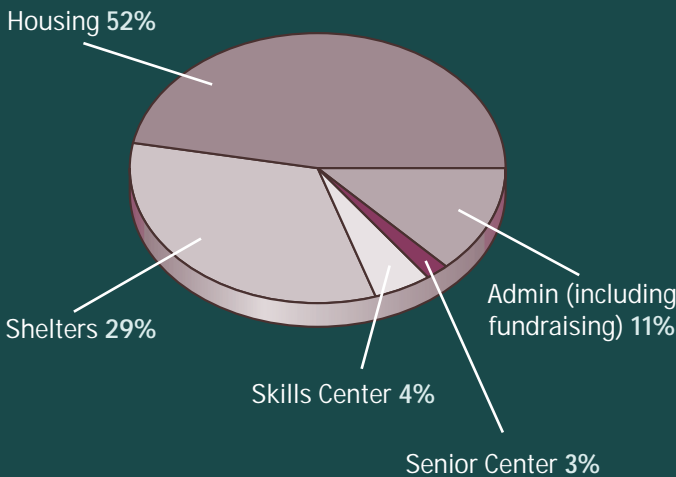
