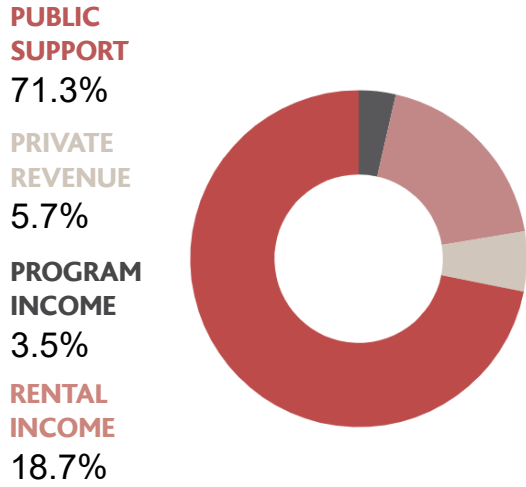
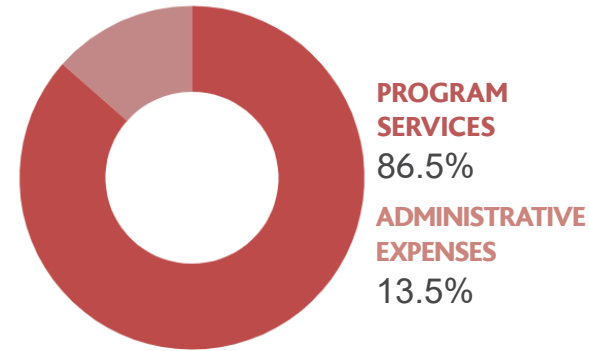


FY2024 Financials

Dear ECS Community,

I am deeply heartened to have a community that believes in our mission of ending homelessness and trusts in ECS to implement that vision. We have always accepted this responsibility with humility and pride. We know what is at stake for the people impacted by the indignity of homelessness and our community as a whole.

This year we expanded permanent supportive housing through the grand openings of two sites, The Diva Community in San Francisco and The Arks Community in Marin, which has created 165 new homes for formerly homeless people. We now support Marin County's inclement weather shelter, rapid rehousing for Richardson Bay boat dwellers and families receiving CalWORKS, and more.

Regional expansion is a key component of our strategic vision. The homelessness crisis cannot be solved in silos. As we continue to invest in San Francisco and Marin, ECS has also begun reaching the East Bay through the launch of a seasonal weather shelter in the City of Alameda.

ECS Programs

Permanent Supportive Housing

ECS provides services at 21 permanent supportive housing sites, combining over 2,000 units with tailored, on-site social services to more than 2,300 individuals. Residents are invited to take part in community activities such as holiday celebrations, barbecues, museum outings, and case management services. This year, we celebrated the grand opening of the Diva in San Francisco and The Arks Community in Marin.

Workforce Development & Social Enterprise

ECS supports more than 600 people annually with opportunities and training for stable employment and better jobs. Our services include culinary and social services training, job search assistance, adult education and high school completion classes, and job retention support. CHEFS (Conquering Homelessness through Employment in Food Services) now offers catering to the general public.

Healthy Aging

ECS programs support healthy aging for 1,419 individuals with a focus on health, well-being and community involvement. Our Canon Kip Drop-In Center provides low-income elders and disabled people with a hot lunch, case management, access to a computer lab, exercise classes, support groups, free groceries, field trips, gardening groups, and more.

Behavioral Health

ECS shelters, permanent supportive housing sites, workforce development programs, and scattered sites benefit from the expertise of Behavioral Health Specialists. Specialists guide participants through a process of self-directed goal-setting that builds upon participant strengths through services including assessment, diagnosis, referral, consultation, brokerage, counseling and crisis management.

Interim Housing

Shelters provide hot meals, health services, and laundry and shower facilities. ECS also partners with organizations and regions to provide emergency shelter. With the San Francisco Interfaith Council, ECS manages the Interfaith Winter Shelter. This year, ECS helped open the Alameda Warming Shelter and Marin Inclement Weather Shelter, providing a safe place to sleep and meals to roughly 650 people. In total, ECS served 1,476 people in the past year.

Adult Coordinated Entry System

ECS participates in San Francisco's Adult Coordinated Entry initiative, a community-wide intake process to tailor solutions and resources for people experiencing homelessness. Staff at Access Points support participants through an innovative mix of problem-solving, assessment, and housing referrals. ECS assessed 5,496 clients for supportive housing in the past year.

Scattered Sites

ECS served 918 individuals in the past year with vouchers, flexible housing subsidies, and other partnerships, such as the Family Rapid Rehousing Program (FRRH), a short-term rental subsidy program for families who receive services from Marin CalWORKS and are experiencing homelessness. The program provides housing location, move-in assistance, a tapered rental subsidy and housing stabilization services.

After Suffering Serious Setbacks, Alethia Found Home

In 2008, Alethia was working in management at Kaiser Permanente. She lived in San Francisco with her husband and daughter, until her husband was arrested. After a series of his arrests and incarcerations, Alethia was left as a single mother with a drained savings account, one income, and a house in foreclosure. Then she got laid off, and became unhoused.

Alethia was able to find temporary housing in a shelter in San Francisco. After suffering a stroke, however, she was unable to get in and out of her building. Alethia connected with an ECS case manager and moved into ECS' 1064 Mission Street, a brand new apartment building that better suits her needs.

"The new place now has an ADA compliant elevator, so I have a little more freedom to move. I've been exploring, 'cause I can get out (laughs). My home is my sanctuary, it's my safe space."
